





- **Purpose:** Support and encourage research through management of research grants, conference abstract submission and research presentations as wells as providing education to researchers.
- 2023 Members: Lisa Barker (Chair), Kate Fetterplace, Lee-anne Chapple, Kate Lambell, Oana Tatucu, Ra'eesa Doola, Elizabeth Viner Smith, Andrew Xia, Elena George

2023 Achievements:

- Development of Mentoring Program
 - 16 mentees and 6 mentors, with 45% considering a research higher degree and 50% having never submitted a conference abstract before
 - 12-month program offering monthly zoom meetings, alternating between didactic lectures from senior researchers and small group mentoring discussions
- Publication of abstracts from 2023 conference for first time in Clinical Nutrition ESPEN
- Successful delivery of novice research workshops at last two scientific conferences

Malnutrition Taskforce- Ibolya Nyulasi

Malnutrition in hospitals continues to be high, unrecognized and undertreated in Australia and New Zealand

Purpose

- AuSPEN is the only society that is tasked to promote the highest standards of clinical nutrition to alleviate malnutrition in health care settings and community
- This group will explore how AuSPEN could:
- Promote malnutrition awareness.
- Identify how NSQHS standards are implemented in Australia –similar standards in NZ
- Lead Nutrition Day participation
- Generate reports and position papers to influence and advocate to governmental and other bodies
 - Explore the proposed ICD 11 codes impact on malnutrition identification and revenue impact in case mix funded settings.
